# COSTERS DEL SEGRE (DO)

Named after the River Segre, which flows through the heart of this region, Costers del Segre has seen many transformations in wine production during its 20 year history. One major development is the production of local varietals, which are then blended with established Merlot or Cabernet Sauvignon grapes. The resulting wines are considered to be the most unusual in Spain, thanks to imaginative producers experimenting with local traditions, and the climate and soil working together harmoniously.

## TOMAS CUSINÉ

Having established Castell del Remei as the pre-eminent estate in Costers del Segre, Tomas Cusiné decided to tackle a rather ambitious project – a new estate in the historic village of El Vilosell. The warm, arid climate here is ideal for the vines, as Cusiné had hoped when first producing wine here back in 1982. Leaning towards a spicier classification, the wines generally offer a high fruit concentration and more rustic character that is both appealing and delicious. Amazingly, the low prices in no way reflects this wine's superior nature.

## GEOL, 2006

A blend of Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon, Cariñena, Cabernet Franc and Marselan, this delightful wine exudes rich aromas of dark fruits including cherries and blackberries. Smoky, coffee notes lend support.
